Okay, Senator Dworak is going down there to get the message directly from Papio and we will find out just how accurate the whole darn thing is. What I am suggesting though is that we leave it just the way it is. Let's not adopt the Senator George amendment until we get to Select File and we have a chance to verify whether the Papio is right or whether the World Herald is right or whether Senator George is right or who the devil is right. I would like to see this in writing before we actually take a hasty move here. I am going to suggest that Senator George withdraw his amendment. We will do it on Select File. That will give us a, if it is bona fide, and if it is bona fide, I see nothing wrong with the amendment, but if you are sincere about it, we can do it on Select File and in the meantime we have a chance to go ahead and confirm what the Papio Resource District is telling Senator Dworak up on the phone right there and right here in this Chamber. Since I can't think of anything more to stall with, I am going to shut up, and I thank you very much. I am going to suggest we not adopt the George amendment.

SENATOR MARVEL: Okay, Senator Warner. Excuse me, Senator George. I apologize. Senator George.

These were proposed Papio dams that had absolutely nothing to do with the NRD which is called Papio NRD. That Resource District has nothing to do with it. This is an arrangement which could have taken place if the federal program would have established the dams and then it would have demanded a matching program between federal monies and state monies to start recreational areas. The NRD is not involved at all. Senator Keyes was wrong that we just authorized the money. That money is sitting there and shouldn't continue sitting there for seven years. The state taxpayer has paid for that. We ought to
