CLERK: January 1, 1980, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And mine would change that to January 1, 1979 and that is the amendment that I am offering to Senator Wesely's amendment, Senator George.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion before the House is the Chambers amendment to the Wesely amendment and the only change, Mr. Clerk, is the date, is that correct?

CLERK: Yes, sir, that is correct.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All right, Senator Newell, your light is on. Do you wish to speak to the Chambers...okay? Senator George, your light is on. Senator Chambers, do you wish to close? Okay. Motion. Read the motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers moves to amend the Wesely amendment to change the operative date to January 1, 1979.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the Chambers amendment to the Wesely amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. We are ready to go back to the Wesely amendment. Senator Wagner, do you wish to speak to the Wesely amendment to the Maresh bill?

SENATOR WAGNER: I have got a question of Senator Wesely.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay.

SENATOR WAGNER: Senator Wesely, you described an average sized family or you mentioned an average sized family. Could you describe that to me as to what you consider an average sized family?

SENATOR WESELY: It is two parents and two children. Now I know that isn't the case with you.

SENATOR WAGNER: Would you say I do or do not have an average sized family?

SENATOR WESELY: No, you are a very special case, Senator Wagner.
