CLERK: (Read LR 5 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MURPHY: A question of the Chair, Mr. President. The purpose of altering this bill initially was to place it on the primary ballot and I want to confirm or I would ask confirmation from the Chair that in order to accomplish placing this on the primary ballot, we must have a vote of four-fifths of the Legislature, 40 votes, and I just wanted the Chair to advise me if I am correct.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, the Chair verifies what you just said. It takes 40 votes.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question is, shall LR 5 pass. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1435-36 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The resolution is adopted. Before the Legislature gets away I would like to make a couple comments. One, is that to try to cooperate with everybody's schedule I would like to have us convene tomorrow morning at 8:30 and be in session until 12:30 at which time we would adjourn for the Easter holidays. The second point I wish to make, some of you asked about Final Reading. I said there wouldn't be any. There is 542 which needs to pass tomorrow and this is the deficiency bill. That is the only bill that we will vote on Final Reading, 542, so I misspoke not knowing that this was going to come up immediately. With those remarks, Senator Nichol, would you like to recess us until 1:30?

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I move we recess until 1:30.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to recess until 1:30. All those in favor say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. We are recessed until 1:30 and the Committee on Committees meeting is when, Senator Marsh? Okay, immediately. We are recessed until 1:30.
