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and it's been said several times, there is no eminent domain. It is a good buy, and I just don't think we can afford to pass it up.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Well I heard the name Louisville mentioned and I'm not familiar with the park area itself, but I'm curious to know how close it might be, how far are we from Mahoney Park?

PRESIDENT: Was that a question?

SENATOR MURPHY: Yes, maybe Mr. Reutzel could answer it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel, you don't have...

SENATOR REUTZEL: I wouldn't touch that one.

PRESIDENT: Alright, you received your answer, Senator Murphy. Alright, was that it, Senator Murphy? Okay. The Chair recognizes Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President and members of the body, you're a fool all of you that support this issue, because I think they need it. We are blessed with some fine parks, and especially in my immediate area we have one fine park at Ft. Kearney, also a recreation area which will be improved even further. I agree with everything that's been said about the population being in the eastern part of the state, and they not having the facilities, and making a long trip out to central Nebraska or even western Nebraska. So I oppose Senator Dworak's amendment and support the money that's been set aside for this park for Omaha and Lincoln, and others close by. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Speaker Marvel.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I don't want to foreclose debate if there are those who would like to talk but...

PRESIDENT: We're ready for a closing...

SPEAKER MARVEL: ...by my count there are 34 legislators here, and I think that what we should do is to pass over this bill and pick it up when we return on Tuesday. So, whoever wants to...after the closing then I think the thing to do...otherwise if we read the bill and spend the time reading it, and then it doesn't pass, then we'll have
