SENATOR SCHMIT: No, Mr. President, I am not.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. As long as you're there, what about LB 319 which has to do with regulation of sale of goods made by inmates?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, I can take 319.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Why don't we move on down to LB 319? We're going to have to jump around a little bit, and this may...Senator...oh, okay. Senator Schmit, do you want to go ahead with 319? Oh, the Clerk needs to read the bill first.

CLERK: Mr. President LB 319 was introduced by Senator Loran Schmit of the 23rd. (Read by title LB 319.) The bill was read on January 16th. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Committee amendments by the Judiciary Committee, Mr. President.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, there are Committee amendments. Is Senator Nichol here, or did someone from Judiciary care to handle those?
