

custodial care. This clarifies it so that the receipts from the restaurants, the cafes, other services that are collected will also go to that revolving fund. Currently they do go to the general fund, but this is treating those few areas within the State Capitol or State Office Building in the same manner as we do all other state agencies for the daily...day to day operation of the Capitol and State Office Building. Page 9 is where there is a change in the fund name. The old name was the State Building Fund. It's being changed to the State Building Revolving Fund, and again it's to give greater distinction. We do have a building fund, for Capitol construction that established...this gives a clear...a greater clarity that this is a separate fund from that one. There are a number of changes throughout the bill which strikes the word "he" and either inserts the "administrator", or "he or she" in some instances, but that is what is required of the standard procedure as you know as far as the bill drafting is concerned. Page 12 also allows...deals with the building administrator, and allows them to make again a charge back to agencies for state owned buildings. The specific reason that this particular amendment is in is because of the construction that perhaps will occur in the state laboratory in which some other agencies will be moved in, and they will be charged for that in the form of a lease for their space they use. Again the purpose of this is to permit us to maximize the use of federal funds proportionate to the agency's total budget for the operation of the state lab, and again it would result in a reduction in the general fund. The amendment...Page 13 is one that I already explained that was included in the Committee amendment. On Page 14 there is some stricken language which just...it's something that's not now done and it's stricken because it was superfluous to have it retained in the statutes. On...

SENATOR WARNER: Okay. The amendment on Page 16 was the one I've already discussed dealing with the rules and regulations to be used for the manner in which claims are filed. It's now very specifically spelled out in the statute, which is more appropriate. The amendment on Page 17 and 18 essentially is all clarification of how travel... the costs can and are to be computed, all of which will be covered by the rule and regulation procedure. There is new language at the bottom of 17, which is the same
