out that is on the computer, public information, is a written consent from the agency involved prior to the time that you can get it. Frequently, or at least occasionally, there will be some times that even discussion on the floor in which members want specific information relating to some detail in an agency's operating budget and if we had the ability and direct access into the computer for that information it would expedite and assist the Legislature in the consideration of these issues. What the Committee amendment does, it very narrowly restricts what access we would have into the computer files dealing only with that information that is under the authority of the accounting administrator of the Department of Administrative Services, and only that information which would otherwise be public information as far as the individual agencies are concerned, and restricted only for the official duties that the fiscal staff has in relation to the Legislature. Such things that are specifically excluded then would be you could not get information relative to individual employees or any personal information that they may have. All it is on, for example, in the accounting manual, or accounting of agency's authority and information, would be by number. It would not have any personal information. It could be by total salary paid, that kind of thing, but there would be no personal information available. You could not get an accumulated list of employees and addresses for example, which would be inappropriate. It relates only to that data that specifically and directly relates to the development of budgets, and the purpose is to be able to acquire that information more rapidly for the use of the members as is required. I think it is sufficient. We spent a great deal of time discussing this amendment because it was a concern in the Committee that we in no way provided misuse of that kind of information or that in no way would we have access to information that should be properly be kept under a secure condition, and I think the amendment as proposed by the Committee meets that requirement and I move its adoption.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lewis.
