SENATOR LEWIS: Well accessibility to confidential information may be important to other Committees and to other Committee staff people.

SENATOR WARNER: This is not confidential information. That is what is specifically excluded. The only thing that we're talking about is the accounting cost, the financial portions that are on the computer. In all cases this is absolute public information. The process under the security requirements of the law are now, that in order for you to make a request of the fiscal office to get some information that you wanted five minutes ago because of floor discussion... the process is we'd have to get written permission from the agency prior to the time that you could, the staff could get it from the...off of the computer, and in no way are we suggesting, or in no way will this permit any kind of reduction in the security type information, confidential information, none of that is in any way available to the Legislature nor should it be.

SENATOR LEWIS: But...well, this is consent and this is not the time to discuss the issue, but I want to look at that a little bit and talk to you privately about it.

SENATOR WARNER: That would be excellent.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any further discussion on the... we're discussing the Committee amendments? Do you want to move the adoption of the Committee amendments, Senator Warner? Senator Warner, do you want to move the adoption of the Committee amendments?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, excuse me, Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Committee amendments to 193. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.
