CLERK: (Record vote may be found on Pages 1491 and 1492 of the Legislative Journal.) 46 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting and 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed. 428A.

CLERK: (Read on Final LB 428A.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: (Record vote may be found on Pages 1492 and 1493 of the Legislative Journal.) 45 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting and 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed. The Clerk will read on Final Reading LB 560.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Warner moves to return LB 560 to Select File for a specific amendment. Would you like me to read the amendment, Senator? The amendment reads as follows, Mr. President: (Read Warner amendment as found on Page 1493 of the Legislative Journal.) That's offered by Senator Warner, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, do you want to speak to the amendment?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, what the amendment does, the bill changed the designation of the funds through which data processing functions from a data processing fund to a different title of data processing revolving fund, and the bill is... the amendment is essentially technical. The bill did not contain the language of transferring the balance that might be in that cash fund over to the data processing fund which needs to be done at the beginning of the fiscal year, so that transfer would occur on July 1. It puts an operative date also of July 1 in the emergency clause, and the operative date, of course, is needed so that the effect of it is on the beginning of the fiscal year. It's essentially a technical amendment that needs
