SPEAKER MARVEL: Clear the board. Shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor and record your presence. Senator Kennedy, Senator Murphy, Senator Landis, Senator Koch, Senator Cope, Senator Keyes, Senator Wesely, Senator Schmit, Senator Hefner, Senator Johnson, Senator Hasebrook, Senator Brennan, Senator Wagner, Senator Hoagland, Senator Marsh, Senator Pirsch, Senator Kelly, Senator Clark. The House is under Call. Senator DeCamp, everybody is accounted for except Senator Kelly.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay. So everybody knows what the motion is, all it was was to cease debate and I had a Call of the House because I thought then you would have to have a Call of the House because of the motion coming up, the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want a roll call?

SENATOR DeCAMP: No, if they want...just call in votes on ceasing debate. Then you can do what you want on the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. All right. You are authorized to call in votes if you like.
