

accurate or inaccurate, whatever, and it is not going to fly. So I recommend as follows: you adopt the amendment and that means, yes, indeed they have to come back here every year and we sit here and haggle and auction and that is the way it has to be. We are not going, as a Legislature, to pass a bill that sets a precedent for automatic escalation clauses for judges when we rejected it on Workmen's Compensation, on unemployment, state employees, University, you name it, it is not going to happen here and the judges know it and you know it and I know it, so why not get the thing done and quit wasting two more hours. Twenty-three days left, half a dozen of those are going to be used up on Final Reading alone. Probably fifteen or twenty major items left to dispose of on General File plus your Select File and we have just about blown the entire day on this when we all know the final outcome and the final outcome is you are going to adopt the amendment. You are going to adopt the committee amendment as amended or some slight variation of it and we are going to pass the bill. So let's get it done and quit wasting time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Reutzel, there are two other names. All right. Senator Koch.
