SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 492.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The amendment is adopted.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move...

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have a series of amendments. The first is offered by Senator Burrows. The amendment can be found on page 1121 of the Legislative Journal, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: Mr. Chairman, I would like to ask, I think there are three amendments on the desk in sequence, directed down the same route but I would like to withdraw the...ask unanimous consent to withdraw the first two, leaving the third amendment that was just placed up there this afternoon.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Excuse me. Is there any objection? If not, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Burrows now moves to amend: (Read Burrows amendment as found on page 1508 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: All right, this amendment is exactly the same language as is in on page 1121 except for the capitalization and the punctuation. It accomplishes exactly the same thing but I think it is technically correct and I checked with Paul O'Hara. Now he wanted the unladen, "an unladen" struck. This was a drafting error they felt in the original bill and the striking of the "an unladen" was done in the original committee amendments which were
