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into the bill the certificate of need requirement before a nursing home or some other sort of existing facility can be transferred. The transfer of the existing facilities was completely taken out by the committee, and that as the previous one I discussed creates one of the major loopholes. Now under the 1122 review, the Health Department has been reviewing transactions involving existing facilities since February of 1973. Because the committee amendments also take out the 1122 review, we really need this mechanism put back in because without such a review mechanism there would be no effective limitation on cost incurred in the sale or lease of an existing facility. Now I know Senator Simon is going to want to address that problem a little bit later. Mr. Speaker, my time has run out. I will leave my light on and explain the remaining seven or eight amendments when my turn comes up again. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Sieck, do you wish to be recognized on the committee amendments?

SENATOR SIECK: I will yield my time...

SPEAKER MARVEL: I am sorry, the amendments to the committee amendments.

SENATOR SIECK: Yes, I will yield my time to Senator Hoagland so he can complete his.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Hoagland, do you want to proceed?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Thank you, Senator Sieck. Now the fourth particular amendment I would like to discuss, colleagues, is found on the next page and it is amendment #6. Now what amendment #6 does is it restores the section 1122 review that has been in effect in the State of Nebraska, as I indicated before, since February, 1973. Now it is essential that this review be reinstated. If this review is not reinstated and if the committee amendments otherwise pass, why the cost containment bill that we would be passing this session would indeed be weaker than the current mechanism we have in place right now. Now that is not to say section 1122 alone is sufficient because it is not. It is not even sufficient to meet the federal guidelines but that has to stay in and that is what we are doing with amendment #6. All right, now turning two more pages to amendment #8, amendment #8 puts back into the certificate of need review site acquisition and the effect of the amendment as the comment indicates in the right hand column is that the cost incurred by a health care facility for acquiring land would
