SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol, do you wish to speak?

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I call for the question please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Are there five seconds? The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. Debate is ceased. Senator Goodrich, do you waive closing? Okay, the motion is the Goodrich motion to send the bill back to the committee. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Senator Goodrich. Record the vote.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return to committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance the bill to E & R for Review. All those in favor...excuse me. Senator Simon, your light is on. Senator Wesely, your light is on. All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Do you have something to read in, Mr. Clerk?
