SENATOR NICHOL: No, I wanted to introduce this new bill #917 quickly if I might.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Oh, okay.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I come to you humbly requesting a new bill to be introduced at this late date. It isn't that I want to but from some of the attorneys they tell us we should do this. I passed out an introducer's statement of purpose to you a little while ago, and for those of you who are interested, of course, you can read it in detail. It has to do with the prejudgment attachment which needs some modification and part of it, I understand, is unconstitutional and we would have a quick hearing within a week or so and have a good look at it, and if we thought it was necessary to do it this session, we would come back with it. If not, we would not. So I sincerely ask for request #917 to introduce a new bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman, your light is on.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Raise the Call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Call is raised. The motion is the introduction of a bill by the Judiciary Committee. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on introduction of a bill by the Judiciary Committee. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion, Mr. President.

Mr. President, a new bill, LB 597. Title read. (See page 1537, Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is that all?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I move we adjourn until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Nine o'clock. All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. We are adjourned until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.
