CLERK: (Read Lamb amendment found on page 1121 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR LAMB: As I explained before, Mr. Chairman, this is merely a technical amendment that should have been in the bill and it merely carries out the purposes of the bill as I explained before.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch, do you wish to speak to the technical amendment?

SENATOR KOCH: Question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we are voting on the... We don't need the question as long as those who have their lights on don't want to speak to the amendment. Senator Pirsch, do you want to speak to the amendment? Senator Lewis does not. Senator Haberman, do you wish to speak to the amendment? Okay. All right. All those in favor of the Senator Lamb's amendment to LB 226 as read vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.
