LB 226, 251

SENATOR LAMB: I believe we might as well have a Call of the House. It has been a long afternoon and we will just put everybody on record.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question is, shall the House go under Call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Sorry.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 7 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats. Record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Senator Burrows, Senator Landis, Senator Schmit, Senator Kahle, Senator Goodrich, Senator Reutzel. Senator Beutler, would you please record your presence? Senator Lamb, we have all but two here, Senator Kahle and Senator Schmit. Do you want to proceed? Do you want a roll call vote? The motion is the indefinite postponement of LB 226. All in favor of indefinitely postponing vote aye, opposed vote no. The Clerk will...

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on pages 1566-1567 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried. The bill is indefinitely postponed. Do you have some things to read into the...?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, your committee on Government, Military and Veterans Affairs whose chairman is Senator Keyes to whom referred LB 570 instructs me to report the same back to the legislature that it be indefinitely postponed.

Senator Koch asks unanimous consent to be excused the afternoon of Thursday, April 19 and all day April 20th.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we are ready to go to item Number 8 which is Select File. The Chair recognizes Senator George.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 251, the E & R amendments were adopted by the body on April 3 of this year. I now have pending amendments offered by Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, thank you. I believe the amendments to LB 251 have been distributed to you and there is the first sheet that gives you a brief overview. The amendments were proposed first by the City of Lincoln, that is why we were holding up that bill for awhile. We have subsequently given those amendments to the City of Omaha and
