SENATOR GEORGE: It eliminated a provision that originally in the bill said as a third method of financing any other legal means. I'm specifying that because to me it is like a blank check and I want to have it very specific as to what those third means are.

SENATOR FOWLER: I have a question for Senator Brennan on downtown Omaha. Senator Brennan, this morning there was a good deal of discussion about problems in the downtown Omaha area. I was just wondering if the need for parking existed between 13th and 24th street?

SENATOR BRENNAN: You didn't ask me if I was going to answer the question. Yes, that was double parking.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is on the George amendment to LB 181. Senator George, do you have a close?

SENATOR GEORGE: No, I move the adoption of the amendment.
