We went through this yesterday. These rules are not mine, they are yours. It takes an unnecessary amount of time to constantly ask a few to get...that is all I am going to say. The House is under Call. The House is under Call. We will not proceed with the vote until all legislators are in their chairs. Do you want...Senator Kahle, where are you? Do you want a roll call vote? Call the roll. Let me remind you what the motion is. The motion is the advancement of the bill to E & R for review. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on pages 1587-1588 of the Legislative Journal.)
