SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you Mr. President. I basically would like to support Senator Venditte in trying to see that something finally has to get done in that district, but I have some questions as to his amendment, and maybe Senator Venditte could answer some questions. Senator Venditte, did you say that you want to actually vacate within two hundred yards and remove all buildings and relocate people? Is that part of the amendment?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Well I'm not so much concerned with all buildings, Senator, as much as I am concerned about all people.

SENATOR GEORGE: How do you imagine that could be handled if you want to...this is a highly densely populated area, isn't it?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Well, Senator, I'm not sure that two hundred yards would be, you know, the key, but I think once we get the bill back to Select File I could work with Senator Schmit and members of the Ag and Environment Committee and perhaps come up with a reasonable number of yards that could be....a percentage...

SENATOR GEORGE: You are talking about several million dollars plus the fact that maybe people don't want to be relocated there. I just hope that you can find some other solution to it. I certainly would support that, but I think your amendment certainly needs a little more work done.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Okay, and perhaps, Senator, if you could support the bill back to Select File, we could work on that very concern that you have.
