Okay, we go to the balance of Final Reading today, and the first bill, we have three more bills on Final Reading, LB 543. Clerk will read. All legislators please be in their seats.

CLERK: (Read on Final LB 543.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: (Record vote may be found on Page 1615 of the Legislative Journal.) 42 ayes, 0 nays, 4 excused and not voting, 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed with emergency clause attached. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading LB 555.

CLERK: (Read on Final LB 555.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: (Record vote may be found on Page 1616 of the Legislative Journal.) 44 ayes, 0 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed with emergency clause attached. The Clerk will now read 557 on Final Reading.
