CLERK: (Read on Final LB 557.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. For those of you in the balcony, this bill authorizes the payment of legislative salaries. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote may be found on Pages 1616 and 1617 of the Legislative Journal.) 39 ayes, 7 nays, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. Before I.....a group in the balcony, I would suggest that the way the schedule is going, we will have no alternative but to start meeting in the evening. I would appreciate having you set aside seven to nine p.m. on Thursday. In the north balcony from Senator Kelly's district, it's my privilege to introduce forty-six 5th Grade students from Westlawn School, Grand Island, Shari Paden and Roger Lee, teachers. They're in the north balcony. Will you raise your hands so we can see where you are? Okay. The Clerk has some items to read into the Agenda before we...into the record before we recess.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Fowler offers a proposed rule change which will properly be referred to the Rules Committee. Your Committee on Government, Military and Veterans Affairs whose Chairman is Senator Keyes, to whom we referred LB 86 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File with amendments. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined and engrossed LB 181 and find the same correctly engrossed, and 395 correctly engrossed.
