SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we are now on the Newell amendments to the committee amendments. Senator Murphy, do you want to talk on the Newell amendments to the committee amendments?

SENATOR MURPHY: Just a question of Senator Newell. Senator Newell, in this striking are you eliminating the provision that they shall also provide for expenses?

SENATOR NEWELL: No, I am not.

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: Yes, sir. Well, Mr. President, I think that there are two or three issues that ought to be discussed here. The Newell logic of course can be referred to the executive branch, if the Governor starts dealing in politics and we have got a commission to automatically set his salary then perhaps he ought to be excluded, and perhaps, Senator Reutzel, I have this amendment and you talked me out of offering it this time, that the Legislature ought to be out. So, if we get the Newell amendment and if I include the executive and the legislative, I think that we have got a clean bill. We have got a commission that doesn't do anything. Now the issue is this. I want to set the record straight right now. First of all, I voted against the last two pay bills for members of the Legislature because I think that it is ridiculous for the membership in here to stand up and try to milk another hundred dollars or two hundred dollars a month out and prostitute yourself over and say that is the only reason that we are here. I'll vote for a bill to pay the Legislature \$25,000 or I'll vote for a bill that says a dollar a year and expenses. You know those are the legitimate options. The legitimate options are not \$675 a month or \$400 a month, we ought to have an inflationary factor and it ought to pay for my apartment and my Phillips credit card and I would go for that I guess. But I don't want this bill to be interpreted as a bill for this membership to raise their salaries. Quite frankly I am sick and tired of talking about that issue. I don't get up every morning and start talking about that. I took this job on the basis of what the conditions were. I am willing to accept that. When I talk to a constituent I don't want to talk about how poor we are and how much we need a raise. I do think that it is important that we develop some kind of an organized system to pay those members of the executive and the judiciary out of this would be to gut the heart out of it. If the purpose of this bill is to kind of finesse a legislative raise, then lets bring that forward. Lets take an honest proposition to the people
