

and cans in the roads, ditches out ten miles from town. As far as I am concerned and as far as many people in the rural areas are concerned this is the real problem. If we don't have a bill that attacks this problem, then we do not have a bill that I consider viable. So, for these reasons I urge the body to kill this bill and we will go on to better things.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I want to support Senator Lamb's eloquent speech and Senator Fowler's probusiness stance, this afternoon, and I'll let that conclude my remarks.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Question okay?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Question has been called for. Do I see five hands? All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, those opposed vote no. Question is shall debate cease. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 8 nays on the motion to cease debate.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Chair recognizes Senator Fowler to close on his motion.

SENATOR FOWLER: Okay, this bill has been brought in before and it has failed in the past. There are several major deficiencies in the legislation that despite efforts to rewrite and re-rewrite and re-re-rewrite this bill have not been solved. Now, I think that we have talked about the questions as far as the tax, who it applies to, the confusion there. You may remember the year that they required everybody to have a litter bag. Well they realized that that was kind of dumb so they took that out. But there still is a concept on page 3, Section 17 that has been in previous acts that has been a source of major objection. That is a vague requirement that trash receptacles be set up in what are defined, and if I could just read, litter prone activities and litter prone areas shall be required to have appropriate litter receptacles meeting minimum standards established by the department. The Council, and that is the Environmental Control Council, shall by regulation determine what are litter prone activities and litter prone areas. This seems to me a tremendously broad grant. This department is going to say that a filling station lot, maybe Senator Lamb's country road, maybe certain fields where a lot of people seem to gather for parties, maybe various places are litter prone areas, or even more difficult for me to understand is how
