That is not going to change and if you are going to discriminate against these people let's not discriminate against the military veteran. Let's not discriminate against the individual who is serving his country, who is mature enough to do that. That was the issue in 1972. That was the issue in 1969. That is the issue today.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Let's call the question.

PRESIDENT: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? The question is shall debate cease on the Newell amendment? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Debate ceases. Senator Newell, do you have any further closing?

SENATOR NEWELL: I do. I would like to caution my colleagues. I am offering this one amendment and I will be forced to offer another amendment and I have more amendments and more amendments. Now I think what we have to do here is to be reasonable. You can shut off debate before, you know, anyone has had an opportunity to speak. You can shut off debate before discussion and that is a real show of strength, a real show of power but I think in deference to the Speaker, when I said to the Speaker I would only offer this one amendment and, Senator Marvel, I have to change now because of the unfair way in which this debate is moving. I am going to have to offer other amendments because this is basically unreasonable in the way they are shutting off debate, not allowing others to speak and so forth, but let me say if you are going to be reasonable, if you are going to ask people to keep the debate very simple, very clean and so forth, if you are going to put that burden on people like myself and others who oppose this legislation, then you ought to be courteous enough to at least allow discussion on those few things that we offer. Now I am not going to expand any longer about the merits of this amendment. I think it is meritorious. The issue is military veterans who come home on leave. They can prove that. They have ID cards and so forth. It is not an administrative nightmare
