SPEAKER MARVEL: One minute.

SENATOR KELLY: Last but not least I would point out a letter that I received from Kearney from two students, Karen Rodehorst and Jim Maroncelli and I give you this for your edification is that alternatives available to 221, one would be to attack the DWI problem and have the bars open twenty-four hours a day to eliminate drunk driving. Now I have no objection to anybody supporting me that supports this amendment because we will have a debate on Select File with the 3.2 amendment that would be similar to the United States military to Kansas, South Dakota and Colorado.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan, do you wish to be recognized on the Dworak-Hoagland amendment?

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, very briefly and I simply want to say that I support this particular compromise. I think Senator Hoagland and Dworak did an excellent job in bringing it to us. I would like to ask Senator Hoagland a question so we are very clear. Senator Hoagland, are there you and others who previously were opposed to LB 221 and now with this amendment you would be in support of it? Is that what I understand?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I can't speak for anybody but myself, Senator Cullan, and frankly I'm not sure I am going to vote for 221 myself even with this amendment because I think there are probably, personally, I think probably there should not be any change but I want to bring this amendment to the body so other people can consider it, but I am afraid I can't speak for other legislators, Senator Cullan, because I haven't talked to them about that.

SENATOR CULLAN: Okay, thank you, Senator Hoagland. Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I am going to vote for this amendment but I would hope that the bill moves if this compromise is adopted and I am going to vote for the bill in any case but I think that this is the correct way to go and I am going to support them but I would hope that you would do so as well.
