CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Record your presence. Senator Kelly, there are six absent, three excused, three unexcused. Someone asked me, one of the members asked me before noon whether we were going to vote on this. I said I didn't think so. There are six who are not present, three are excused.

SENATOR KELLY: We certainly don't want to bring those people back like we have done other times under a Call of the House. I really don't just know what to do here. It would appear to me that we really should, under the rules of the Call of the House, have people report to those calls. I recognize that we are far into the noon hour. Is it within the rules, Mr. Speaker, to ask for a postponement of the roll call vote until after lunch?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Not when we are in the middle of the vote. The only thing I would know to do would be if there are not enough, you are on the losing side, you can ask for a re-consideration.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you very much. Please proceed with the roll call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Are all legislators in their seats? Okay, call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on page 1652 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kelly.

CLERK: Senator Kelly, changing from yes to not voting. 22 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. The Call is raised. Do you have anything to read in before we recess?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, I have a communication from the Governor addressed to the Clerk. (Read message from the Governor found on page 1653 of the Legislative Journal.)
