But the very least we can do is to take a look at the thing again next session, and if we put this kind of a date on it, we're going to take a look at it. If we don't take a look at it, we're going to compound the problems, and I can guarantee you one thing, gentlemen and ladies, whether you vote for this amendment or not, you will be taking a look at it again next session. You'll be taking a look at it possibly before that time, because there isn't anything else you can do. There are going to be so doggone many problems that will develop with each and every subdivision, that as we go back home and explain to the people what we tried to do, they're going to wonder why in the world and how in the name of heaven we were able to create the monstrosity we have created. Public opinion may demand a lid. I'm not sure about that. The one thing the public opinion does not demand is the kind of legislation which we compound here with amendment, after amendment, after amendment. I ask your support of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion...Senator Keyes and then Senator Kremer on the proposed Schmit amendment.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, Mr. Speaker and fellow senators, to those of you who are listening, Senator Schmit wants to put an end to it next year, and which might be a good idea. He says that, go out and pay his tractor fuel bill with seven percent. President Carter of the United States tried to put this federal government of ours under a seven percent lid. The former Governor of this state tried to put the state under a seven percent lid. Some of the senator did last year, tried to put us under a seven percent lid. It may not show any results, and Senator Schmit, if we don't have the other money to spend, perhaps it will do the one thing...I want everyone of you to hear this, the one thing that has happened since the first of January till the last of April, and that is that the interest rate on CDs and the cost of the United States have dropped three-quarter of a percent, one of the best things that ever happened to this nation, and it's because the people of this state and the people of the nation that says we are through with ten, fifteen, twenty and thirty percent inflation. We're ready to go back to a seven percent lid, so gentlemen, when you get through fooling around with this bill, I'd ask you to consider the amendment I have
