SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: The same proposition, gentlemen. Do we apply state funds, or do we not? I move the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Murphy amendment as explained. All those in favor of the adoption of the amendment vote aye. Opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

SENATOR MURPHY: Can I say something? Is this mike on? Mr. President...

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: On a point of personal privilege, Senator Marsh called my attention to the fact that I omitted her when I said gentlemen, and Senator Marsh I want you truly to believe that I wouldn't wanted to have included you in what I was thinking of those gentlemen.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Outbursts are not allowed in the Legislature. Have you recorded the vote?

CLERK: 9 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. Clerk, read the next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Murphy now moves to amend LB 285 to amend the DeCamp amendment, Page 1500. I think he withdrew that one, Senator.

SENATOR MURPHY: Lucky me.

CLERK: Do you still want to consider this amendment then? Okay. Mr. President, Senator Murphy moves to amend in the Koch amendment in line 6 strike "the average increase of combined receipts for the previous three years and insert in the percentage increase in population."

SENATOR MURPHY: I withdraw the amendment. That issue has already been trampled.

CLERK: Alright. Mr. President, the last amendment I have is offered by Senator Keyes, and the amendment is to strike the Committee amendments and all other amendments to LB 285.
