LB 69

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 69. Title read. The bill was read on January 5 of this year. It was referred to the Banking Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by Senator DeCamp's Banking Committee, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, this is Special Order set by the Speaker for an hour and thirty minutes which will bring us out to about eleven o'clock and the Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp for purpose of the committee amendments on LB 69.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, and Senator Murphy, the committee amendments are the bill now so everybody understands. I introduced the wrong bill. Now people don't often do that but I did. There were about ten drafts so I introduced the wrong one. So prior to the hearing, everybody was notified, bankers and everybody else, so the hearing was held on the proper bill. There was some wrong language and so on and so forth in the original bill. The amendments are the proper bill so I would hope we could at least on this one little point this morning adopt the committee amendments and it is not "substituting a completely different bill" because the public hearing was specifically held on the committee amendments, so on and so forth. I urge adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Hefner. No. Now speaking to the committee amendments only. Seeing no other persons wishing to speak on the subject, Senator DeCamp, that will be your close on the committee amendments, will it? The motion then is the adoption of the committee amendments on LB 69. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the committee amendments on LB 69. Have you all voted? Senator DeCamp, do you want to have a Call of the House and get everybody in for the bill?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I don't know if it is this difficult at the start.

PRESIDENT: The Chair is just trying to be helpful.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes. I think it will work its way up.

PRESIDENT: While you are talking, have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.
