SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I suppose it is only fair to both sides to have a Call of the House and get everybody in and a roll call down the line.

SPEAKER MARVEL: A Call of the House has been requested. All in favor of placing the House under Call vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats, record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Senator Burrows, Senator Keyes, Senator Schmit, Senator Beutler, Senator Fowler, Senator Maresh, Senator Kremer, Merz, DeCamp, Hoagland, Chambers, Pirsch, Reutzel. Ray, Mr. Sergeant at Arms, Senator Reutzel, Senator Pirsch, Senator Chambers. Senator Dworak, Senator Kennedy, Senator Koch, Senator Marsh, and Senator Kelly are excused. The House is under Call. CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 1678, Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Clerk, read the motion.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.
