

state. Once this is completed however it will go to ninety-ten match...ninety percent federal, ten percent state. In order to monitor an oversight in accounting as that transfer takes place, that language accounts for that. The figures that appear on Page 13, 14 and 15 are in there for informational purposes and for the ability to audit as to how those welfare funds are used. Section 14 deals with the Military Department tuition credit reimbursement. The appropriation bill as you recall now places funds...appropriates funds directly to the Military Department for the tuition of members of the National Guard, and this is language related to that. There's language covering the Game and Parks Commission included in the capital construction bill. There is authorization for an electrical load shedding device in the Lincoln Headquarters Building and this is the report on how it functions. This is a kind of a mechanical equipment that levels out the load of electrical use avoiding high peaks and should have substantial benefit and a cost reduction in the electrical use in that building. Section 16 places the maximum dollar amount that the Racing Commission should be using in their operations. The balance of their funds are distributed as aid to county fair and 4-H programs. The Board of Nursing, there is language directing them not to make prepayments. They have on future operating costs...they've had a tendency at times to make substantial prepayments which tend to distort their budget requests. Starting on Page 17, Section 18, there is a series of pages all dealing with the Correctional Improvement Program. I might...the primary thing I suppose I might point out in that is that this is the last year, or will be the final year for that Correctional Improvement Program as the intent language indicates. Starting on Page 25 there is again language directed toward the Coordinating Commission Postsecondary Education requesting that before they would submit any state plan on postsecondary education of any federal agency that the plan would be reviewed by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council and also again direction that no general funds would be requested to replace loss of federal funds should their various sources of federal funds no longer be available. On Page 26 there is language covering the state colleges all of which would be relative to the oversight capacity and the ability to monitor the use of the funds that are being appropriated for the program classification structure which is the manner in which we can tell right down to each class how funds are being used in this area. There's a series of language that is relevant to role and mission legislation for various reports that are consistent with the role and mission requirements. There's also language on Page 29 indicating
