LB 75, 467

I gave you, you'll see a section (b) which is a building out there that they would like to use for the State Patrol and perhaps other agencies. This merely gives the property to the Department of Roads who is in charge of housing of the State Patrol. This way they would be at liberty to use this building for that. The arrangements for the four buildings marked (a) has not been determined, nor (c), (d) and (e), which (d) you'll note is a barn, (c) and (e) are houses. If they wish to, they may sell those if this is a prerogative of the Road Department. Mr. Chairman, I move for the advancement of LB 75.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR NICHOL: Incidentally there is no money involved here. The Department of Roads would be using money out of their budget for whatever purposes they want, and if they should sell some of this property it would probably be additional money for the budget.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I just wanted to point out to Senator Nichol I hope they do sell the two homes. There was like 30,000 requested for renovation or maintenance on the homes, which we did not recommend because we thought it would be more appropriate to sell the two homes. So there is money to be gained I think even though that...there will be less money that will need to be spent by the selling of those two homes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of the bill to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. We pass over LB 460 and, Senator Maresh, are you ready to take up LB 467? The Clerk will read. 467.

CLERK: Mr. President LB 467 was introduced by the Business and Labor Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read title to LB 467.) The bill was read on January 17 of this year. It was referred to the Business and Labor Committee. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. The body considered the bill on March 19th of this year. At that time it failed to advance.
