SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman your light is on.

SENATOR HABERMAN: A question of Senator Koch, please. I'm looking at the fiscal note and there is about three of them and only one of them scares me and that's \$216,000. I hope that isn't the right one.

SENATOR KOCH: That is not germane to the subject. The amount of money that Senator Warner can verify this, I think the fiscal note is about \$82,000, isn't it Senator Warner?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, the fiscal note dealt with the section that was taken out of the bill by the committee amendment which dealt with the computer system and that is what it related to and that is not in the bill any more.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you. That is a relief.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 141 to E & R for Review. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the advancement of 141 to E & R for Review. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted for the advancement of 141 to E & R for Review? Have you all voted? Senator Koch. Have you all voted?

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, surely there must be people around here who want to push a button. Senator Landis said he'd vote but he's up here in the balcony and can't reach this far. Thank you, Senator Landis.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill is 158.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 158 was introduced by Senator Gerry Koch of the 12th. (Read title to LB 158.) The bill was read on January 9 of this year. It was referred to the Urban Affairs Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments, Mr. President, by Senator George's Urban Affairs Committee.
