any length of time would cause extreme difficulties. Therefore, the committee felt that the removal of the Department of Correction officers, probation officers, and parole officers from the training requirements was necessary. I move for the adoption of the Committee amendments. Now I should say in addition to that, Mr. Chairman, that in alleviating these people that I have talked about we would reduce the fiscal note from \$259,000 to \$114,000. Mr. Chairman, I move for the adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR LEWIS: Thank you, Senator Nichol. We're on the committee amendments. Senator Haberman, do you want to speak to the committee amendments?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I have a question of Senator Nichol.

SENATOR LEWIS: Senator Nichol, will you yield?

SENATOR NICHOL: Yes.

SENATOR LEWIS: Ask your question, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Do the committee amendments address themselves to the cost in the orange sheet that's attached to 565A, the...what they call the...

SENATOR NICHOL: The fiscal note?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Haberman, I haven't look at that. I have a letter from the fiscal office, and that was where I gained that...Senator Chambers perhaps has that information at his fingertips.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Senator Haberman, this bill had a fiscal note attached to it based on the way it was originally introduced which the fiscal office must do, and they were not aware of the amendment which would eliminate so many of these state officers. So that fiscal note in the book would not be correct and they will not be able to print a revised version revising it downward until the adoption of this committee amendment which will eliminate this large number of parole, probation and other types of officers from the bill. So when this committee amendment is adopted it will reduce the fiscal note.
