LB 285, 525

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would like to print amendments to LB 525 and Senator Keyes to 285. That's all I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now if I can have the attention of the Legislature for a few minutes I'd like to talk about next week. You have...I hate to pound the gavel for myself, but I would like to visit with you for just a moment. We have passed out tomorrow's agenda...tomorrow's agenda together with a consent calendar, which once again approaches the General File bills. Now, I would suggest that what you do by tomorrow is get a hold of a work sheet and take a look at Select File, and you will find that this is where the next serious problem comes as far as this Legislature is concerned. First of all it has to do with a series of appropriations bills. Yesterday we advanced several appropriation bills from General File to E & R for Engrossment and shortly they will be on Select File. So on Monday afternoon we will set aside at least two hours for discussion of appropriation bills. We need to get at this by that time and I would appreciate it if you would put that on your agendas and look forward to it for Monday afternoon. In addition to this you will find on Select File most of the bills that we debated at some length on General File, and I'm talking about 571 which is the gasohol bill, 172 which is the....somebody help me out, today has been long... certificate of need, 152 which is the gambling bill, 390 which is the interest bill, 138 and 138A which have to do with Medicaid as far as counties are concerned. Now we have to attack Select File starting the first of the week if we're going to get out of here with any more work done. So I would suggest to you that we'll spend at least two hours on appropriations, and we need to begin to get at these bills that we have already debated, and I hope we don't have to redebate everything on Select File that we debated on General File, but those bills are there for your consideration. I want to call them to your attention. I want to call them to your attention so that we can be prepared for next week. You have the agendas for tomorrow. You have some suggestions for next week, and if you have any comments within the next few days, I would appreciate any that you have. Now, Mr. Clerk, do you have anything else on the desk?

CLERK: I have nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There are still some who think that the Legislature is going to meet tonight. When we adjourn in
