LB 42, 425

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance LB 425 to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. Senator DeCamp, do you wish to take up your amendments to LB 42? Your motion, first.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to return LB 42 to Select File for a specific amendment. Is that correct?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, just to...so I understand, you had two separate amendments printed. The one on 1572 we are withdrawing. Is that right? I'm sure.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Dan will come up and look and tell you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Are you asking unanimous consent to withdraw?

CLERK: Right.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Is that right, Dan? Okay.
