SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, I know it would be terrible expensive, but I wonder why we don't have that record for all cancer treatments and then we could find out what our percentage of cure really is.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The chair will remind those of you in the balcony, neither you nor this Legislature according to our rules and regulations can demonstrate. Please don't make it necessary for me to say that again.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, I feel that we can accept this amendment, and as Senator Labeledz has said, but I still wonder if we aren't singling out one treatment over the others and perhaps we will have amendments to clarify that before this is over. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I see no others who are interested in the Murphy amendment. Senator Murphy, any comments? The motion is the adoption of the Murphy amendment to the Labeledz amendment. Is that right, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Murphy's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment is adopted.
