SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Before we proceed to the consent calendar, and I wish that the legislators would look over the consent calendar and see if there are any bills that you have special particular interest in, I would like to introduce two groups in the South balcony, the first group from Senator Stoney's District, 103 sixth grade students, four teachers, 17 parents from Montclair Elementary School, Omaha, Nebraska. Linda Gibbs is the teacher. Will you raise your hand so we can see where you are? There they are. Welcome. And there is also a group from Senator Sieck's District, 14 first and second grade students, one teacher, one parent from Gresham Elementary School and Diane Braasch is the teacher and you are in the South balcony. Hold up your hands so we may see where you are. Welcome. All right, since there are probably not enough here to be safe with regular Final Reading, may we go to the consent calendar and see how we can progress for awhile. Senator Cullan and Senator Hoagland, are you ready for LB 490? Who wishes to take it up?

SENATOR CULLAN: We would ask to pass it over for a few minutes. We are going to meet with Senator Chambers and we may get it going.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All right. Is Senator Chambers in the room? We will pass over a couple of his bills and then we will come back to them. Let's go down to, Senator Duis, are you ready for LB 391? Okay, the Chair recognizes...excuse me.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 391. Title read. The bill was read on January 17. It was referred to the Retirement Systems Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, Senator Hasebrook will take...do you want me to take them? Okay, I will be happy to. The committee amendments to LB 391, and 391 is the retirement bill for state employees and county employees and it raises the age from 65 to 70 years of age in compliance with the federal law and the bill which I originally introduced applied only to county...that is, to state employees so the Retirement Committee in their wisdom included the other employees that
