SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 514. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, members of the body, a veterans organization asked me to introduce this bill for them, and what this bill would do, it would permit non-profit corporations such as the Legion Clubs, VFWs or lodge or other service clubs holding a Class C license to be open for business seven days a week whereas now they are only able to be open six days a week. And, of course, this is only in those localities that other licensees are permitted to do so. Now what we just did with the amendment, we would still let the local people have control over these licenses and tell them what hours they could operate and I urge you to support the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of the bill as amended, 514. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted?
