LB 282

The Clerk will read LB 282.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 282. Title read. The bill was read on January 15. It was referred to the Public Works Committee. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President, by the Public Works Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Okay, Mr. Chairman, what the committee amendments do, it puts a limit on the per diem that can be paid to the Directors of an Irrigation District and also puts a limit on the amount of mileage that can be paid. I move adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is to adopt the committee amendments to LB 282. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the committee amendments to LB 282. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the committee amendments are adopted. Now before we advance the bill, in the South balcony from Senator Kahle's District, 29 seventh and eighth graders, three teachers from Hildreth, Nebraska Public Schools. That is where my wife first started teaching school. Gary Fisher is the Superintendent-elect. Would you raise your hands so we can see where you are? Senator Wagner, do you want to move to advance the bill?

SENATOR WAGNER: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I would move to advance the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is to advance LB 282 to E & R for review. Do you have any additional comments?

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. Chairman, this bill provides by statutory limits that the mileage is 8¢ and today with the way that mileage is it is outdated. It does change the provision to bring it back to a section of law that anytime the mileage is changed and this updates it. The other thing was that Al Voight from western Nebraska was hopefully wanting to increase the amount and this would help for younger people to take part in serving their district out there.
