SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner is asking unanimous consent to withdraw amendments to LB 227 which are in the Journal on page 1665. Is there any objection? If not, so ordered.

CLERK: Senator, would you like me to read your amendment?

SENATOR WARNER: Actually, Mr. President, Mr. Clerk, it is the identical amendment that was in the Journal with one last section, a subsection three stricken so what the... all the amendment does...this is a bill that allowed a credit for vehicles that were disabled during the period they were disabled and after the amendment was adopted for the credit, there was some concern from some of the county treasurers on a procedural basis reviewing them. All this does is it allows them to forward the application of the individual who is requesting such a credit to be, that the actual certificate for the credit would be sent by the State Treasurer who concurs in the procedure and it is valid for one year or a twelve month period as was previously indicated. There is no change at all in the substance of the bill but the process that was used was altered so that the county treasurer, so it would be more convenient to them and it created no problem for the State Treasurer. I move that the bill be returned for the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to return 227 to Select File for the specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is returned.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the amendment be adopted as I explained on the motion to return.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Warner amendment to 227 on Select File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Senator Warner, do you want to make a motion to move the bill?
