That is another problem and we are always going to have those inequities until this Legislature has the courage to meet that straight on but for us to accept 494 and add to the crises, I don't believe is wise. So that is the reason I offer the motion to indefinitely postpone. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the indefinite postponement of 494. All those in favor of indefinitely postponing the bill vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Once more and then we are going to call for the vote. Have you all voted? Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: How many are excused?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Four. A record vote has been requested. Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on page 1738 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 15 nays, 10 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. The bill is indefinitely postponed. Do you have any business to read in?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Senator Newell asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 483; Senator Nichol to print amendments to LB 565A.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is that it? Before we recess I would remind you that this afternoon for two hours we will consider appropriations bills and then we will move to thirty minute bills. Senator Burrows, would you like to recess us until 1:30?

SENATOR BURROWS: Mr. Chairman, I move we recess until 1:30 p.m.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion. Yes. There is no debate on this. You don't debate a motion to adjourn. What is your point?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Speaker, I was envisioning perhaps, a 6:00 p.m. adjournment tonight and if possible maybe we could come back at one o'clock in the essence of saving the Legislature some time. I don't think there are any major luncheons being held today and...
