SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, clear the Board. A Call of the House has been requested. The question is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. The House is under Call. All legislators please return to your seats, record your presence. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Senator Keyes, Senator Wesely, Senator Rumery, Senator Beutler, Senator Kahle, Senator DeCamp, Senator Newell, Senator Marsh. Senator Nichol, Senator Pirsch, Senator Kelly. Have you all recorded your presence? Senator Murphy, Senator Nichol is the only one absent. We are trying to trace him. Do you want to....?

SENATOR MURPHY: If I may simply state the issue that we are removing the provision that under this bill museums and the like will be operated. Those who were off the floor have no way of knowing what has happened. I would ask for a roll call vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Roll call vote? Okay, call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 1764, Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried. The amendment is adopted. The Call is raised. The debate will cease on LB 158. We will recess for about three minutes and then we will start with LB 444. I am sorry, stand at ease. I am having trouble these days getting the right English out.
