and now we order you to be reinstated. Okay, three weeks ago the Supreme Court said, well, there is nothing in the statute that says they can give the remedy even though they have heard the case and they made it clear that if we want that power, which obviously we do and which everybody thought they had, you have to specifically put it in. So the amendment is very important and I would urge you to adopt it and do whatever you want with the rest of the legislation.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Where is this amendment? I don't mind buying a pig in a poke but I would like to see what size poke it is.

SENATOR DeCAMP: So as I say, it gives the remedy to them which, as I say, everybody thought they had until the Supreme Court indicated three weeks ago you had better spell it out if you want it. This is not in the original bill because the bill was on General File when the Supreme Court handed down this decision, by the way.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy, were you completed with your discussion?

SENATOR MURPHY: No. I would ask Senator DeCamp if we are not making quite a czar out of a one man tribunal even though he is required to get two other commissioners to agree with him?

SENATOR DeCAMP: No, no, no, no. I disagree completely.

SENATOR MURPHY: He can here render judgment and the same person will do all these things. What appeal right does the opposing party have?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I am not that familiar with the Court of Industrial Relations. I would rather somebody else goes on appeal rights.
