LB 444A, 285, 444, 572, 136

Now the motion is to advance the bill to E & R for review, LB 444A. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Voting advancement of the bill. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried and the bill is advanced. Do you have anything to read in?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, Senator Carsten would like to print amendments to LB 285; Senator Goodrich to LB 444; and Senator Nichol to LB 572.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we will go to item #6, Final Reading. All legislators please be in their seats. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. All legislators please return to your seats so we can start Final Reading. There is a motion on the desk on the first bill on Final Reading.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Duis moves to return LB 136 to Select File for specific amendment, that amendment being to strike the enacting clause.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Duis. LB 136.

SENATOR DUIS: I will ask unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: No objection, so ordered. The Clerk will read LB 136 on Final Reading.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have another motion on the desk. Senator Rumery moves to return LB 136 to Select File for specific amendment. Would you like me to read the amendment, Senator? The amendment reads as follows: Read Rumery amendment offered on pages 1768 and 1769, Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Rumery.
