SENATOR NEWELL: Well, Senator Lewis, I liked your motion better the first time when you talked about, since the University has made that commitment to spend those monies which have not been appropriated by this Legislature, that it come out of their already existing monies. Now, I expect that...

SENATOR LEWIS: Well, Senator Newell, what I...what I... let me ask it this way.

SENATOR NEWELL: Okay.

SENATOR LEWIS: Would you understand that I plan to support this and take that money and pay for it later on, on another program that we were previously obligated by those that sued us in terms of our legitimate responsibility? Would you mind that kind of token support at this time?

SENATOR NEWELL: No, I do not.

SENATOR LEWIS: Well, then I want to speak to it, Mr. Chairman. Mr. Chairman, I rise to support the Newell amendment. It appears that we're playing a chess game here and we've got forty-nine pawns, and I prefer not to be one, and I've got other remarks later, but I think that we can legitimately get the University off the hook with this 123,000 dollars expended in other areas later. So I rise to support the Newell amendment to take this money off, but reserve the opportunity to restructure it somewhere else.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Simon. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, we talk about the sun setting on some portions of fiscal bills. This is one program that the sun should set on. The SUN program is not working. People are not using it. Agreed it's not much money...123,000, but if they're not using it, if they don't want it, we should do away with it and get the University of Nebraska off the hook on this program that the people apparently don't want, and are not using.
