SENATOR DeCAMP: Not right now. Put it on another bill.

CLERK: Senator Chambers has amendments but he has been excused. I now have amendments offered by Senator DeCamp, Beutler and Johnson.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, Mr. President, these are the important amendments. This one and one other one I will offer. This involves the Attorney General's things, the things where there were areas of confusion, some additional things that had to be put in, and I move adoption of the amendments. Senator Beutler can explain his portion. Senator Johnson can explain his portion. I'll explain my portion. My portion puts in some committee language that Senator Newell had mentioned that got left out, and their committee and Mr. Buccino thought needed to go in. This involves some language on...what do you call it? Ernie had taken out something because he said it was vague. Paul Douglas and some other people seemed to think they absolutely want to have this language in regarding gambling paraphernalia, but they have refined the language so the problems that Senator Chambers raised are hopefully corrected, and Senator Johnson's part deals with the lottery to make sure the pickles aren't abused or all that stuff. As you know, Mr. Douglas, the Attorney General's opinion earlier had indicated we've just absolutely got to do something about the lottery laws. The amendment takes care of that, refines that, and that's about it. The other amendment I'm going to offer has to do with a felony penalty that some people have been screaming about. I move adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment to the bill. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. The motion is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment to 152. Have you all voted? We're voting on the adoption of an amendment to 152. Have you all voted?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, the Legislature is going to have to come back in the room if we're going to get any votes on anything in here.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? We're voting on the amendment to LB 152. Have you all voted? Record. We've got one more amendment.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.
