PRESIDENT: All right, now is there any discussion with that clarification? All right, the question then, that concludes your...that's your closing? Okay, all those in favor of the Newell amendment to LB 489 vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the adoption of the Newell amendment to LB 489.

SENATOR NEWELL: Howard, if you knew what you were doing you'd change your mind.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? Senator Newell, do you want to ask for a Call of the House this early in the morning?

SENATOR NEWELL: We're getting closer.

PRESIDENT: Okay, well I'll entertain your motion right now then if you want to....record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on the adoption of Senator Newell's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The motion is adopted. Senator Landis is here so we can proceed then with the..... Speaker, is that all right? We'll now revert back to the... committee amendments? Senator Landis, we're on the committee amendments now on LB 489. Everybody is waiting with bated breath, Senator Landis, for you. The Chair recognizes Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Everybody can unbate their breath in that case. Mr. Chairman, I think you will find on the Clerk's desk an amendment which I will offer in a moment after I speak just briefly on the committee amendments. If you examine the record of the committee on this bill, you will see that I got a very simple small bill by Senator Brennan into a great deal of trouble. I simply did that by adding an amendment that reduced the weeks of disqualification from 7 to 5...a simple amendment, just two numbers there. Well apparently when you add that up it comes to a million dollars, something that fiscally I was not aware of at the time. It's an amendment that I actually think is important, although I can see that it's not politically feasible. I can also see that it got Senator Brennan's small not particularly wide affecting bill into a great deal of trouble. I have on the Clerk's desk a motion to strike the committee amendments number 2 and 3, which are the references to the 5-week disqualification period.
