CLERK: 17 ayes, 7 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: On ceasing debate, that's correct. How many people are excused? Seven are excused. A great number are not here. The question before the House is, shall debate cease? And we're discussing the indefinite postponement of LB 489.

CLERK: Senator Keyes voting no. Senator Schmit voting aye. Senator Kelly voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Could we have a show of the people that are present?

CLERK: Senator Reutzel voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burrows, you are here. Senator Newell.

CLERK: Senator Rumery.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit....
